
Many of you know Eugene O'Hara, the Director of Restorations at our home, The Automobile Driving Museum. Better known on the show as 'Mean Gene', Gene is the man that connected us with a couple of very generous Rolls Royce collectors over the summer. They were kind enough to loan us their cars for the Ghost episode you will see very shortly. It was one of those collectors, Nick Lemieux, that came to the museum a couple of months ago with the idea for a Concours on St Patrick's Day.

Now those of you that have planned corporate events, important birthdays or even a wedding can appreciate the concept of planning a large garden party has the potential to be challenging. Throw in the prospect of talking friends, friends of friends and so on into bring their priceless cars all on the same day and we are closer to negotiating mid east peace rather than a car event.

Well, Nick did just that – and did it well. He was able to get cars ranging from a 1967 Toyota 2000 GT and fitting for St Patty's Day, a VERY green 1947 Delahaye 135 MS. We threw in four of our own cars – our Eleanor Roosevelt Plymouth, our Stalin Packard our Fabric Bodied Stutz and our Packard Factory Speedster.

One part down, two to go. On to Vendors and Sponsors. That is where the other part of the Ventura Farms Freshman team comes in: Kameron Nesen and Morgan Evans. Both have had a lot of experience in event planning. Kameron does it professionally for the Four Seasons and Morgan runs fundraising and outreach for the show's charity beneficiary, the Westlake Village YMCA.

In setting up the event, the concept was more Quail than Pebble. A one-price ticket gets you in the door and plies you with a mix of drinks and enough food to choke a mule. They had everything from a brilliant local place called Zin Bistro to Wolf Creek Brewery to Pinkberry!

Now the hard part: The venue. If you really think about any car show or Concours you have been to, you really don't pay much attention to the venue. Well, actually, you do if it is less than an optimal choice. We all know Pebble Beach and Villa d'Este are stunners. But do you remember Barrett Jackson back in the mid 90s? WAY before Craig Jackson strong-armed the City of Scottsdale to make it the facility it is today? Not a one car **not** covered with a layer of Arizona dust.

Here is where Nick, Kameron and Morgan really had an ace up their sleeve: David Murdock. David is the self-made guy that went from a US\$1,200.00 loan to transforming Dole Food Company into the largest producer of fruits and vegetables. Well let me tell ya, David's got a crib.

This is where the show takes its name: Ventura Farms is an estate that is almost tailor made for an intimate Concours event. Located in Hidden Valley, California across from Lake Sherwood, the grounds have things you can imagine and things you can't. There is a Great lawn, a Conservatory and of course, a Rose Garden. But that is not what makes this place. It's the 'Grand Allee' of Thai Sculptural Boulders. Translated: Huge rocks that were found and transported from Thailand then curated around the property. Remember *Man with the Golden Gun*? Think pint sized replicas of Scaramanga's Island and you get the idea. It was amongst these Boulders that Nick and his crew arranged Mean Gene's favorite, a 1936 Rolls Royce P3 to one of my show favorites, a Rudge Wheel Mercedes 300 SL to one of the most honestly restored 1959 Porsche 356A's I have ever seen.




2013 Mercedes Benz E63 S (P30 Package) Estate in the new car display


